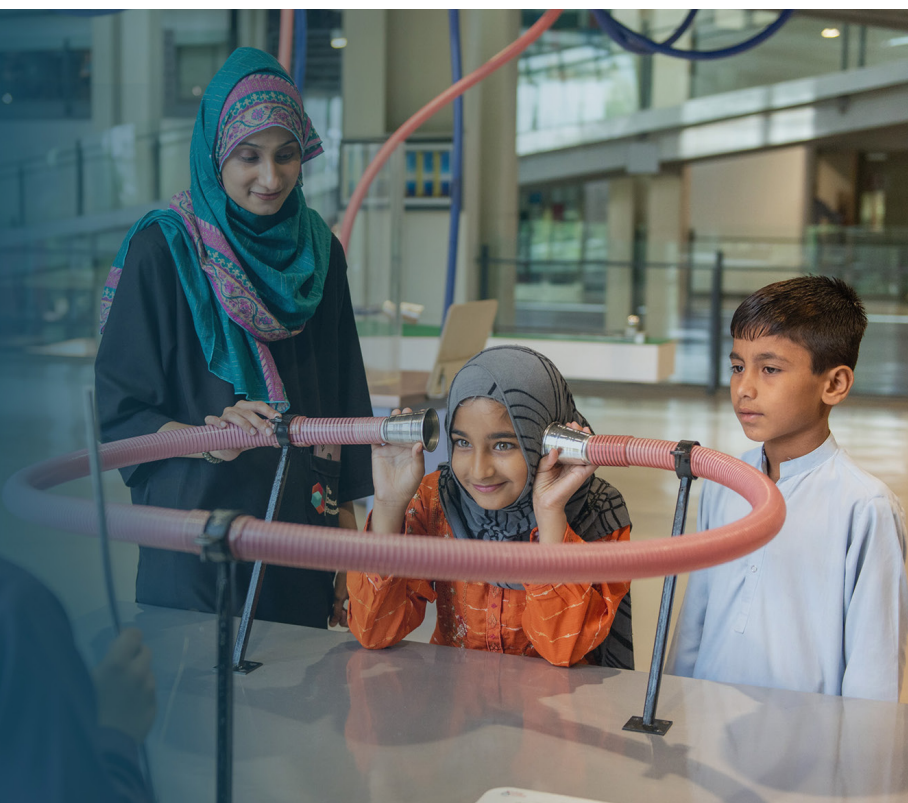

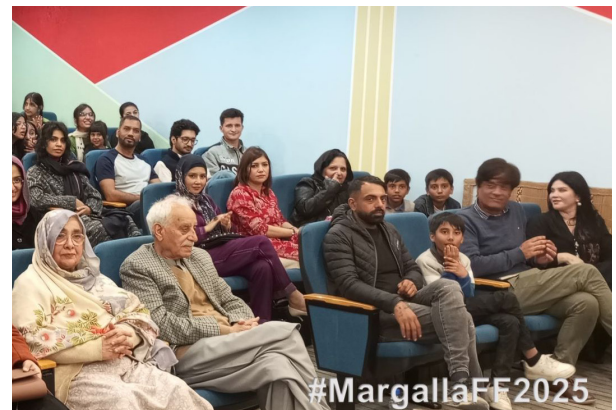

# The Launch of the Digital Heritage Trail

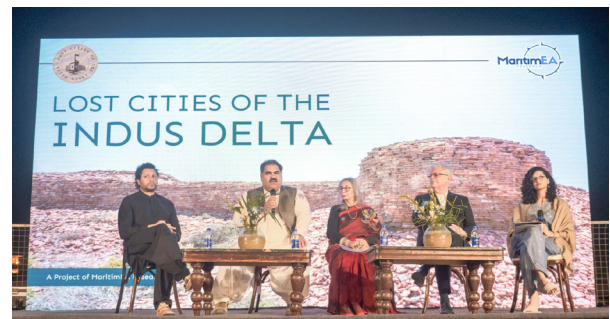
## *A Journey Through the Indus Delta's Rich History*

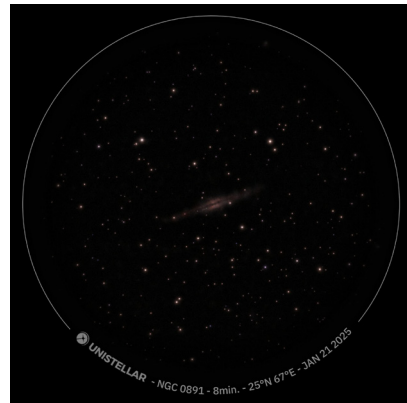




# Planetary Parade

At the MagnifiScience Centre, the eVscope 2 Telescope, generously donated by Shahzada Dawood, has opened a window to the cosmos. This incredible contribution allows to capture and share the beauty of the stars with our community, sparking curiosity and awe.

Among the breathtaking sights we have observed are the M46 Cluster, where ancient red giants tell the story of a star formation that began 500 million years ago; the Orion Nebula, a dazzling birthplace of stars that lights up the night sky; and the Flame Nebula, a cosmic nursery where new stars are born under the glow of the mighty Alnitak. We have also marvelled at Messier 34, a vibrant young cluster brimming with stars just a few hundred million years old, and NGC 891, a majestic edge-on spiral galaxy offering a spectacular glimpse into the heart of the universe.



## Astroverse Session

On the 11<sup>th</sup> of January 2025, astronomy enthusiasts gathered at the MagnifiScience Centre for an unforgettable evening beneath the stars, organised in collaboration with the Karachi Astronomers Society. # Focused Group

## Shaping the Future of Education: Teachers Discuss the Impact of MagnifiScience Centre

Key takeaways from the discussions included;

- Experiential Learning Reinforces Classroom Concepts:**  
 Teachers highlighted how real-world, practical experiences make abstract or difficult topics more tangible, allowing students to better understand complex ideas.
- Influence on Teaching Methods:**  
 The discussions revealed that the MagnifiScience Centre's approach positively impacts teachers' instructional styles. Its visual, tactile, and interactive exhibits enable educators to explain complex concepts more effectively, making lessons more practical and relatable. This experience enriches teaching strategies across subjects such as science, geography, and mathematics.
- Bridging Formal & Informal Learning:**  
 The Centre complements school curricula, particularly through its alignment with spiral learning approaches. Repeated visits at different grade levels deepen students' understanding, making learning more meaningful.
- Enhancing 21st-Century Skills:**  
 Group-based activities encourage critical thinking, problem-solving, collaboration, and communication, nurturing skills essential for holistic development.
- Interactive Exhibits Simplify Complex Topics:**  
 Teachers noted that the Centre's diverse array of interactive exhibits offers an opportunity for students to engage with science in a way that textbooks alone cannot achieve, helping to break down barriers to understanding.
- Informal Learning Spaces Spark Curiosity and Critical Thinking:**  
 The relaxed and open environment of the Centre encourages students to ask questions and explore topics of interest, fostering deeper learning.

The participants also emphasised the need for more initiatives like the MagnifiScience Centre across Karachi and beyond. They agreed that such experiences not only make education more engaging but also inspire a love for learning. The event concluded with a call for greater collaboration between educational institutions and Science Centres to create more opportunities that make learning both enjoyable and impactful for students.

## Differential Densities – January

In January, MSC welcomed science enthusiasts eager to uncover the secrets behind density. Participants explored how variations in liquids affect floating objects, discovered fluid behaviours, and examined density gradients. Additionally, they learned how to create a rainbow using differential densities and unravelled the mysteries of how an object's density relates to its ability to float or sink.

## Reflection & Refraction – February

February saw participants explore the fascinating concepts of "Reflection and Refraction." They learned about the exciting angles at which light reflects and delved into the phenomena of refraction. Participants observed how light reflects, refracts, and creates amazing effects all around us.



## The Surface Factor – March

March was a month full of exploration and discovery through the Surface Factor programme. Visitors learned how surface area influences an object's ability to float or sink, and investigated how the surface of ice affects its melting speed in Ice Fusion. They also learned how surface area can speed up chemical reactions and explored the science behind the Bed of Nails in Surface Quest. The session wrapped up with a Pancake making activity, where participants uncovered the fascinating science behind the art of pancake-making.
